

ASSESSMENT

Students are formally evaluated with a Student Report Card each quarter. The classroom teacher grades students in all subjects except Spanish, Music, Art, PE and Computers. These grades are given by the respective teachers. While parent conferences are held at the end of the first quarter, parents may request special reports or conferences whenever necessary. CITIZENSHIP

A student's Citizenship grade may be lowered as a result of any combination of Tardiness, Uniform Dress Violation, and/or Behavior issues. If instances of the above mentioned occur, your child's citizenship grade will be affected as follows:

If a student receives any grade below Satisfactory in Citizenship during the school year, he or she **will not make Honor Roll.*

HONOR ROLL

Based on end-of-the-year academic and citizenship grades, students in grades 4, 5, and 6 are eligible for Honor Roll. Students with a cumulative 3.75 grade point average (GPA) or higher are awarded Gold Honor Roll certificates. Silver Honor Roll certificates are awarded to students with a cumulative GPA of 3.5 to 3.7. However, regardless of GPA, if a student receives any grade below Satisfactory in Citizenship during the school year, he or she will not make Honor Roll.
